

2022 NIC Spring Conference Preliminary Program

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Senior housing and care leaders are convening in Dallas to explore new models of community and care, build strategic partnerships, and stay ahead of industry disruption, as they shape a new era.

Senior-level executives represent approximately 70% of attendees making this event one of the year's most efficient and effective opportunities to connect, make deals, and explore new opportunities and partnerships.

Safety

NIC takes the health and safety of all attendees seriously, which is why we are requiring every attendee to provide proof of vaccination and their photo in a simple, secure online process handled by Safe Expo.

We are working in close partnership with Safe Expo and Omni to best align with the latest guidelines for COVID-19 safety. To that end, circumstances may require us to revise our safety protocols as needed.

A person is considered fully vaccinated to be admitted to the conference if they are:

- 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine

If the definition of "fully vaccinated" changes to include a booster, NIC will update its policy on the event website and inform registered attendees.

Final doses of your vaccination must be completed by Tuesday, March 8, 2022 to gain entry to the 2022 NIC Spring Conference. If an attendee or NIC staff member does not meet these requirements, they are NOT considered fully vaccinated and will not be permitted to enter.

If you submitted your vaccination record for the 2021 NIC Fall Conference, you do not need to submit it again. Check your confirmation e-mail for your vaccination card status after you register. NIC's current plans include numerous safety protocols to ensure attendee safety.

Protocols include:

- Consulting with a Pandemic Compliance Advisor through every stage of event planning
- Commitment to monitor and align with the latest COVID-19 safety guidelines
- Providing additional cleaning measures in frequently used event spaces
- Placing additional hand-sanitizing stations throughout the event space
- Modifications to event settings that help mitigate risks, such as the educational session format, to spacing adjustments in the session room and networking areas, and food and beverage service protocols
- Compliance monitoring with Safe Expo:
 - Vaccine card uploads
 - Onsite health safety liaison and ambassadors
- Following Omni's Safe & Clean program actively monitors and updates our solutions to ensure they adhere to local government requirements. Full details on our Safe & Clean program can be found **here**.

CODE OF CONDUCT AS OF FEBRUARY 10, 2022

- I will be considerate, kind, and safe (while at the conference and otherwise).



A braindate is a knowledge sharing conversation that attendees can have one-on-one or in a group, on a topic of their choice.


